
BALLOT CARDS

Each child needs I ballot card. Have them write the candidates names on the lines and the title of the election. They place their votes by putting a checkmark in the box next to the candidate they want to vote for. Then, they place their vote in the ballot box.




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
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


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THE	WINNER IS:	
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An election is the process where people vote to choose or elect a leader of something. Election Day is always the Tuesday after the first Monday in November. This is when we elect new leaders for our country. Every four years, adult citizens elect a new President of the United States.

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
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HOW TO VOTE

On Election Day, voters can go to a voting booth. This is where they will fill out a ballot for the candidate they would like to be elected. In some places you can submit your ballot on a computer. In other places, you fill out your ballot on a piece of paper and turn it into the ballot box. When the election is over, the votes are collected in a poll to show the results of the election. The candidate with the most votes wins.


If I Were President:

Have your students brainstorm ideas on what they would do if they were President and write about it. Then they can make the Presidential hat and attach it to their writing.


Campaign Posters:


Your students can create their own campaign posters. Have the draw a photo of themselves. Then they can write a paragraph explaining why they should be elected.






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
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
